






Cities (Friendship Centers, School Districts and other Organizations) Visited, Contacted or Collaborated with in British Columbia, Canada in 2020



281 computers were donated to low income families and students across BC in 2020. These computers were distributed to Indigenous communities, School Districts and other local organizations that distributed the computers to the families in need.

Around 641 computers were donated and 49 Internet connections were set up for low income families from 26 Indigenous communities, BIPOC organizations, School Districts and other local organizations across 19 cities in BC by June 2021.

Having moved internationally to Canada during the pandemic, we faced moving costs, very high flight costs, and the costs of setting up a new home all at once. We were also unprepared for the school system's reliance on technology for assignments and my children were not always able to access or complete their assignments as they didn't have access to a dedicated computer. There were 8 computers distributed to youth for education and social purposes. Many youth that we assist are low income and with the Covid 19 pandemic this created more hardships including social isolation. Youth were disconnected from school, family and friends, social events and gatherings. To assist the youth and families, computers were distributed to support them through the pandemic. Youth were able to reach out and connect with their friends, family and community. Youth were able to attend online school, join in with online support networks, reach out to their youth worker and peer youth groups and attend online zoom workshops.

As the ACYMH program stayed open during the pandemic, ACYMH set up 3 computers for youth to access at Kermode Friendship Society. Kermode provided a safe place for youth to get assistance with their mental physical emotional and spiritual wellbeing.
